



Manuscript guidelines for contributions to the conference volume from the ASLA symposium 2018 in Karlstad

Presenters at the ASLA symposium 2018 will have the chance to send submissions to the upcoming conference publication *Klassrumsforskning och språk(ande): Rapport från ASLA-symposiet i Karlstad, 12-13 april, 2018 / Classroom research and language/languaging: Papers from the ASLA symposium in Karlstad, 12-13 April, 2018*. The publication will be number 27 in the ASLA series and published under ISBN 978-91-87884-27-6. We welcome submissions which present research results in relation to the conference theme “Classroom research and language/languaging”, but we also welcome submissions grounded in applied linguistics more generally.

Length and format

Submissions should be a maximum of 6,000 words excluding references. The manuscript should be sent electronically to asla2018@kau.se by 1st September 2018. Please use our template when preparing your contribution (see link below).

Review procedure

Submissions will undergo double-blind peer-review. Author names should not be stated in the manuscript itself, but be attached as a separate file. If possible, please delete all personal information from the file's properties (choose File and then Inspect document). Those who submit a manuscript for consideration should be prepared for the possibility that they may be asked to review a submission from someone else.

Reviewers will assess whether submissions should be *accepted* (with minor alterations), *revised* or *rejected* based on the following criteria:

- The submission's relevance to applied linguistics.
- The submission's presentation of completed research. Alternatively, the submission's presentation of coherent theoretical reasoning and reflections of interest to the field.
- The submission's level of scientific quality.

- The submission's quality with regard to language and style.

Author biography

A short author presentation should be attached with every article. Maximum 50 words per author. For example:

"First name Surname is lecturer in xx at xx and is interested in xx. Surname is currently working on a project xx, as well as xx."

Language and proofreading

The submission can be written in Swedish, English, Norwegian or Danish. Each author is responsible for the quality of language in their submission. There will be the possibility to proofread a copy of the formatted text at the end of the editorial process.

Layout

Consistently use our template, FormatMall.doc A direct link to the template can be found on our website (under Document)

- Do not use hyphenation or page numbers.
- Use normal for all running text.
- Italics are used for short language examples in running text.
- Italics are also used for emphasised words and expressions.
- Tables should be made with the table tool. A table legend should appear above every table and state: Table 1. Description ... Please use a horizontal line on top and bottom of the table header. Use a horizontal line at the bottom of the table. A reference for each table should be found in the text.

- Figures should be made with the appropriate tool. A figure legend should appear below every figure. A reference for each figure should be found in the text.




Figure 1. Number of students by gender in the three digital game groups.

- Double quotation marks should be used for citations in running text. Longer citations should be placed in a free-standing block of text with quotation marks omitted as displayed in the template.
- Referencing should follow APA 6th Style.
